DO Recycle:

Plastic - All Plastics #1 - #7

Examples:

- Plastic Milk Jugs
- Detergent Bottles
- Plastic Lids and Caps
- Plastic Bottles
- Plastic Toys
- Plastic Shopping Bags
- Yogurt & Margarine Tubs

Glass

Examples:

- Bottles
- Jars

Paper + Paper Products

Examples:

- Juice and Milk Cartons
- Newspapers and Inserts
- Cardboard (cut to fit inside cart)
- Paper Bags
- Envelopes (Plastic Window OK)
- Shredded Paper
- Cereal or Tissue Boxes
- Junk Mail

Metal

Examples:

- Tin Cans & Lids
- Small Metal Objects
- Empty Aerosol Cans
- Aluminum Cans and Foil



Do NOT Recycle:

- Food Waste (Please rinse out all containers)
- Needles/ Syringes/ Sharps
- Hazardous Waste
- Recyclables in Bags
- Ceramics or Dishes
- Lightbulbs or Window Glass

What is Single Stream Recycling?

Single Stream Recycling is a system where all paper materials (including cardboard), glass, plastic and metal items are collected together instead of being sorted by residents. Single Stream makes recycling easier because there is only one decision: Is this Trash, or does it go in Recycling?

Where Do I Recycle Electronics?

Electronics are accepted at the City of Norwalk Transfer Station
